HOMECOMING 2010

Here is some important information regarding Homecoming 2011 and its events. Please share this information with your student and encourage them to participate in our 7th annual celebration.

1. Homecoming Court:

- * Homecoming Court consists of the following couples: Senior King and Queen; Senior Duke and Duchess; Senior Lord and Lady; Junior Attendants; Sophomore Attendants; Freshman Attendants.
- * All members of Court will be announced at a pep rally on Friday, September 23rd.

Note: The Senior Royalty will only be announced by name, not "position." That announcement will come at the pep rally/bonfire.

- * All members of Court will ride in the Homecoming Parade on **Sunday, September 25th**. The parade will take place in Lake Villa at **2:00 pm**. Staging will begin around 12:30 pm at Palombi Middle School.
- * The Court will be introduced at the pep rally/bonfire on **Thursday, September 29th** and the King & Queen will be named at this event. The Court will also be announced at halftime of the varsity football game on **Friday, September 30th**.
- * At the Homecoming Dance on **Saturday, October 1st**, there will be a coronation ceremony for the attendants and royalty at 9:00 pm.

3. Homecoming Dance:

- * The dance will be held in the LCHS gym on **Saturday, October 1st from 7-10 pm**.
- * Tickets will be on sale during lunch periods from **Monday, September 26th through Friday, September 30th**. The cost is **\$15.00** per ticket or **2 for \$25.00**.
- * Students must present their student ID to be admitted to the dance. **TICKETS WILL NOT BE SOLD AT THE DOOR!!**
- * Students may bring guests who do not attend LCHS (the age limit, per district policy, is 20). The LCHS student will need to pick up a form from the main office. *That form will need to be signed and returned before the guest can purchase tickets.* The guest must also bring a valid form of ID to the dance.
- * A photographer will be available for couple or group photos. Photo package options will be distributed when students purchase their tickets. Photos cannot be ordered at the dance without payment.
- * Attire for the dance is semi-formal.

4. Pep Rallies:

- * Two pep rallies will be held in conjunction with Homecoming week.

Friday, September 23rd: A shortened bell schedule will be run for that day, with the pep rally occurring after the conclusion of 8th period. At the pep rally, spirit days for the following week will be announced, and the Homecoming Court will also be announced.

Thursday, September 29th (beginning at 7:00 pm): At this pep rally, all fall sports teams will be introduced! A tug-of-war competition will take place between the classes; the winning class will then take on a the local firemen and police team. There will also be a fun competition between the fall sports teams. The bonfire will follow the pep rally. Naviance is a web-based application that allows students and parents to complete college and career searches. Users also can use it to find quick information about a college or to generate a list of schools that match the user's interests. Lastly, scholarship opportunities also are listed. Explore tests are being administered to incoming 8th graders here at Lakes on Saturday, October 15. Explore serves as the entry measure of academic progress in ACT's College and Career Readiness System. Lakes utilizes the scores of freshmen placement purposes as well as linking to PLAN and ACT.
